“You spend as much time observing as you do painting if not more; the only way to create a good piece of work is to go into nature with no preconceived ideas. Nature is the best teacher because it holds the most accurate information; it’s all there...right in front of you.”

All artists benefit from nature because everything has already been created. It is the artist’s job to paint what he sees and not to take his ability for granted. He believes every piece he does should be better than the last, so the responsibility becomes greater as the consumer deserves quality work.

McMurry enjoys all the outlying areas of the Texas panhandle and has a special interest in landscape and its various times of day, the evening being his favorite time as all the rich color falls on the land, and there is a certain peacefulness to that time. Raised in farming and cattle, agriculture and the preservation of our land and its resources have a special interest for him.
